

RAINIER BEACH: A BEAUTIFUL SAFE PLACE FOR YOUTH

QUARTERLY CRIME REPORT 2026

SPRING- QUARTER 2

(March, April, May 2026)

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This report describes crime incidents in the ABSPY intervention area over the Winter months of December, January, February 2026. It is divided into six sections: One for each hot spot (Rose Street, Rainier & Henderson, Light Rail, Lake Washington, Our Safe Way) and a summary of all hot spots for the quarter. Each section contains the following data:

1. Number of police offenses this Winter 2026 compared to the previous summer seasons, 2014-2026 (by age group and broad category: person, property, society, or other)
2. Number of selected offenses in Winter 2026 compared to the previous summer seasons, 2014-2026 (by age group and offenses of interest at the hot spot: aggravated assault, simple assault, and robbery)

DEFINITIONS OF FREQUENTLY USED TERMS

- **Offenses:** Offenses are events that involve criminal activity. Every offense involved in a single crime activity is reported in the data as a single, distinct crime. There may also be incidents involved within offenses; these are non-crime police activities that took place within the event. We prioritize violent offenses in this analysis. See the example below for information about how this affects the numbers.
- **Incident/Offense Example:** A report will contain all the offenses or incidents that occurred during a single event. For example, during a traffic stop a driver is arrested for DUI and the police impound their vehicle. The DUI is classified as the **offense** because this is the crime that took place during this event. The vehicle impound is classified as an **incident** because this is a police action that took place during the same event, but it is not a crime event.
- **Person Offenses:** Crimes involving a person as a victim, e.g. assault, aggravated assault.
- **Property Offenses:** Crimes involving loss of or damage to someone's property, e.g. robbery, theft, burglary, property damage, arson.
- **Society Offenses:** Crimes that affect public order and quality of life, e.g. disturbances, liquor violations, drugs, threatening behavior, weapons, prostitution.
- **Other Offenses:** Crimes that do not fit into person, property, or disorder categories, such as fraud and trespassing.
- **Youths:** Individuals 25 years old or younger.
- **Adults:** Individuals 26 years old or older.

CAVEATS

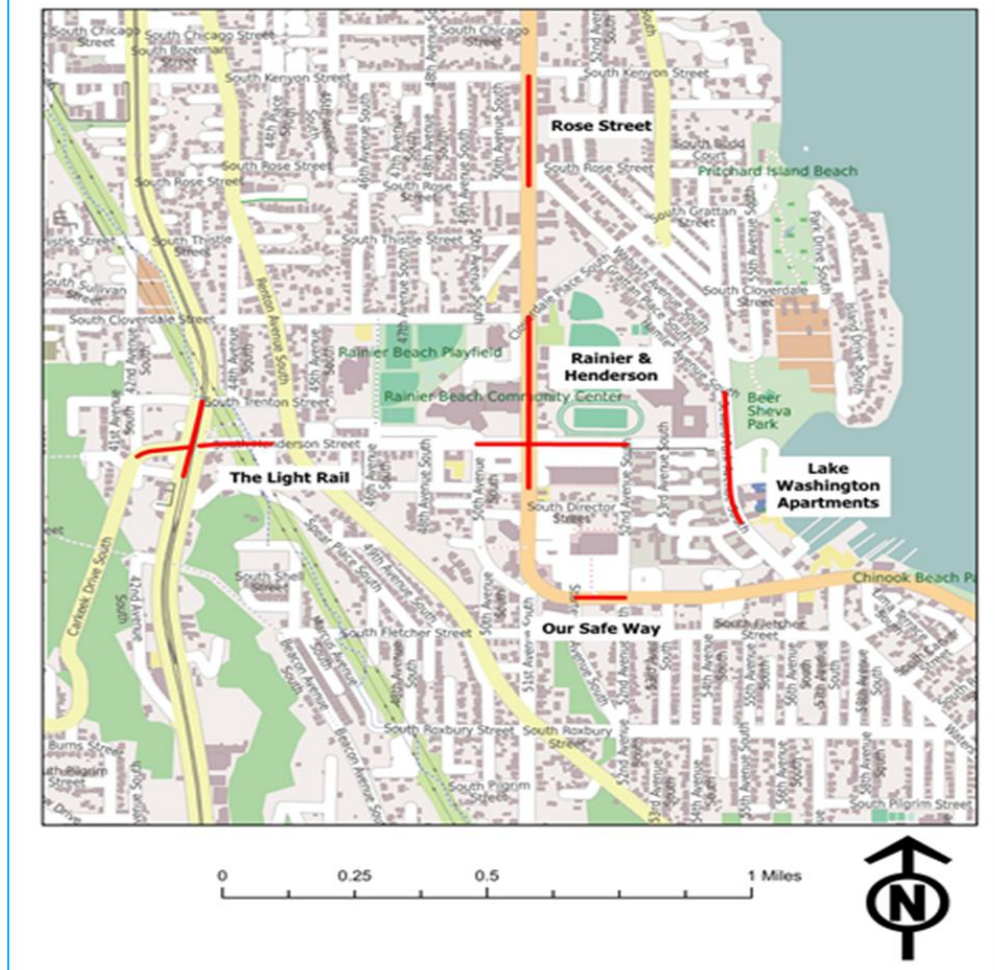
1. Seattle Police Department uses NIBRS data formatting to count and prioritize offenses, with NIBRS grouping categories "Group A" and "Group B" separating the more serious crimes from the less serious crimes respectively.
2. Crime counts can change rapidly from month to month, especially in small areas. Quarterly and even yearly changes are not necessarily indicative of long-term crime trends.
3. The Seattle Police Department recently switched to the NIBRS reporting system and is still in the process of compiling their new database. The new data categorize some offenses differently and as such, numbers are subject to change and should not be compared to previous reports.

MAJOR TRENDS

1. All crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses increased, Property offenses decreased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses decreased. For adults, Person offenses increased, Property offenses increased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses decreased.
2. Person-specific crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault increased, and Robbery increased. For adults, Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault increased, and Robbery increased.

ROSE STREET

1. All crimes – change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses decreased, Property offenses decreased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses remained constant. For adults, Person offenses increased, Property offenses increased, Society offenses increased, and other offenses increased.
2. Person-specific crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault remained constant, Simple Assault increased, and Robbery remained constant. For adults, Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault increased, and Robbery remained constant.

RAINIER AND HENDERSON

1. All crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses increased, Property offenses remained constant, Society offenses remained constant and other

offenses decreased. For adults, Person offenses increased, Property offenses increased, Society offenses increased, and other offenses remained constant.

2. Person-specific crime – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault increased, Robbery remained constant. For adults, Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault increased, and Robbery remained constant.

LIGHT RAIL

1. All crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses increased, Property offenses increased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses remained constant. For adults, Person offenses remained constant, Property offenses decreased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses decreased.
2. Person-specific crimes – Change from Winter 2025 – Winter 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault remained constant, Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery increased. For adults, Aggravated Assault remained constant, Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery decreased.

LAKE WASHINGTON

1. All crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses increased, Property offenses decreased, Society offenses increased and other offenses increased. For adults, Person offenses increased, Property offenses decreased, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses decreased.
2. Person-specific crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault remained constant, Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery remained constant. For adults, Aggravated Assault increased, Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery remained constant.

OUR SAFE WAY

1. All crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Person offenses remained constant, Property offenses decreased, Society decreased, and other offenses remained constant. For adults, Person offenses decreased, Property offenses remained constant, Society offenses remained constant, and other offenses remained constant.
2. Person-specific crimes – Change from Spring 2025 – Spring 2026: For youth, the frequency of Aggravated Assault remained constant, Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery increased. For adults, Aggravated Assault increased Simple Assault remained constant, and Robbery increased.

ALL RAINIER BEACH HOTSPOTS: SPECIFIC OFFENSES BY AGE, GROUP, AND NUMBER

All Events: Quarterly Time Series 2014-2026

In this section, we provide a broad overview and historical context for the more detailed ABSPY hot spots crime statistics that appear in later sections.

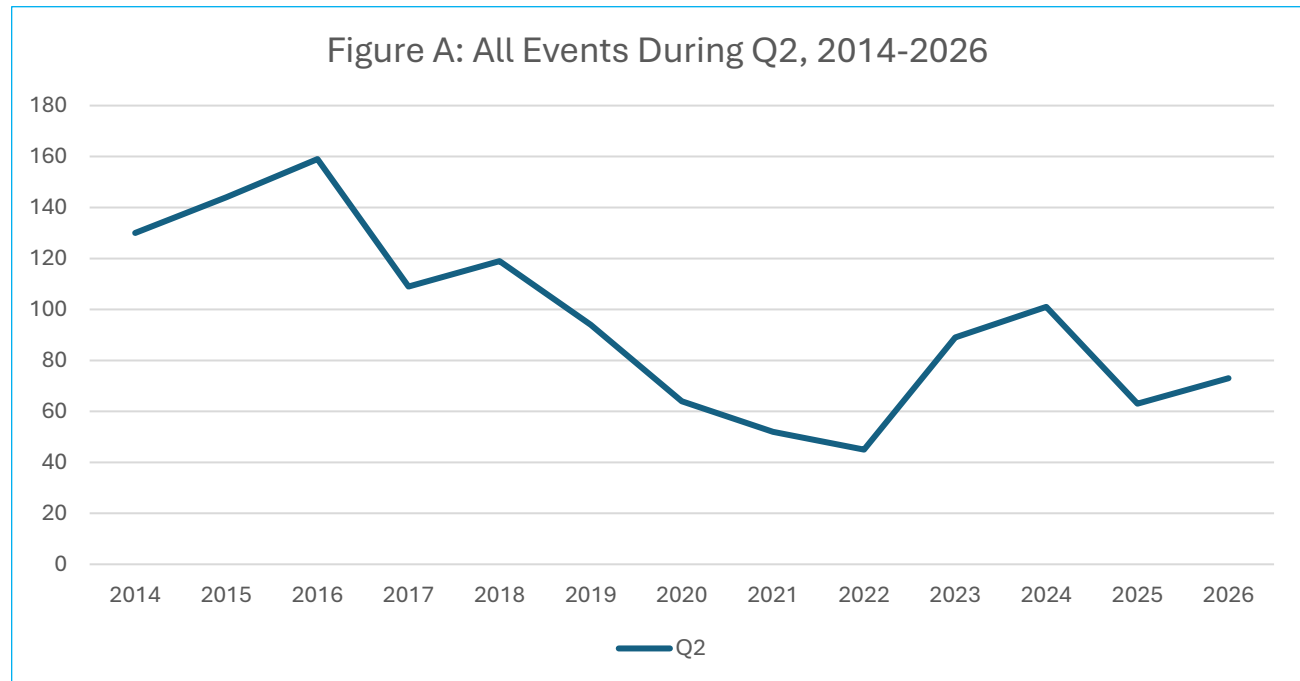


Figure A presents the overall crime statistics during Q2 2026, compared with the same quarter during the prior 12 years. Crime volume during Q2 has an average of 97 crimes per quarter during this period, but as can be seen six of the last seven years have been below the series average as part of a long-term declining trend since 2014. In Q2 2026, there were 73 crimes recorded, and this appears to be part of an upward trend from the low of 45 crimes in Q2 2022.

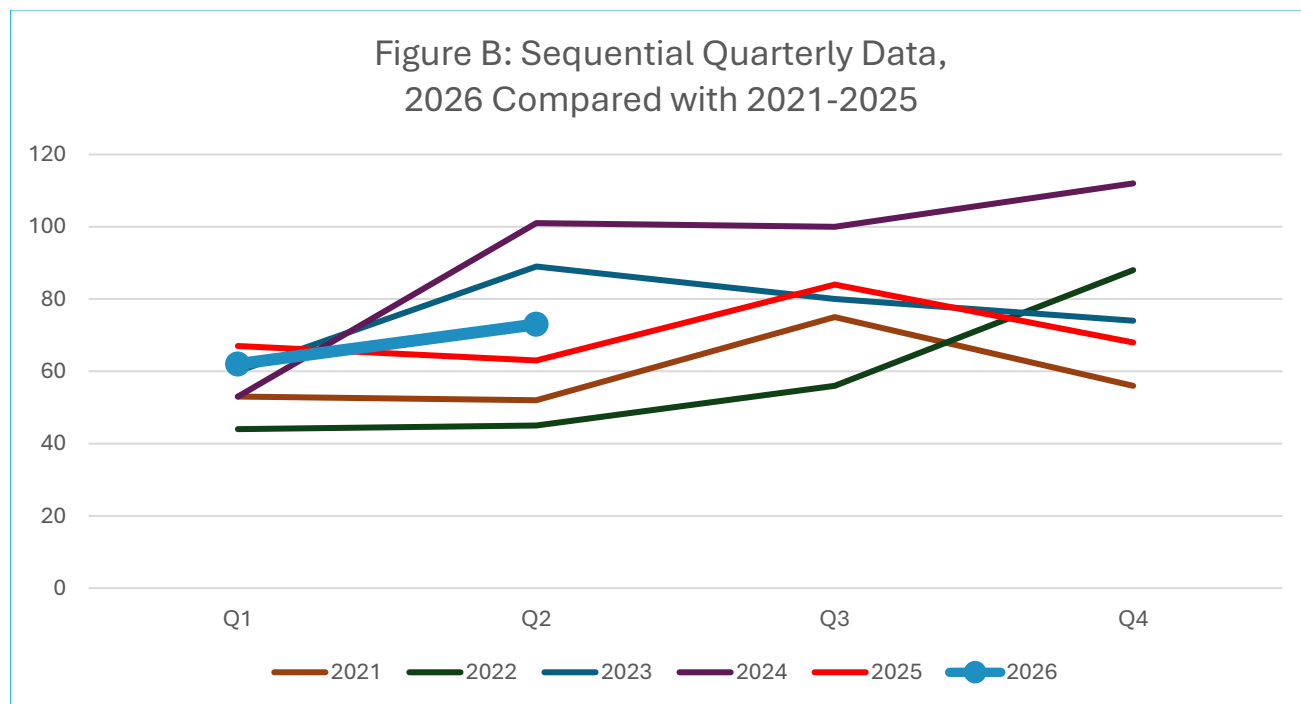


Figure B presents the quarterly data sequentially for the past five years, with 2026 marked as a heavier line with dots. While 2026 started off with Q1 being second highest compared with the previous five years, it was still slightly lower than Q4 of 2025 (which is the consistent seasonal pattern). It can be seen that Q2 of 2026 is in the middle of the Q2 distribution for the previous five years, suggesting a “typical” year in the context of the prior five years.

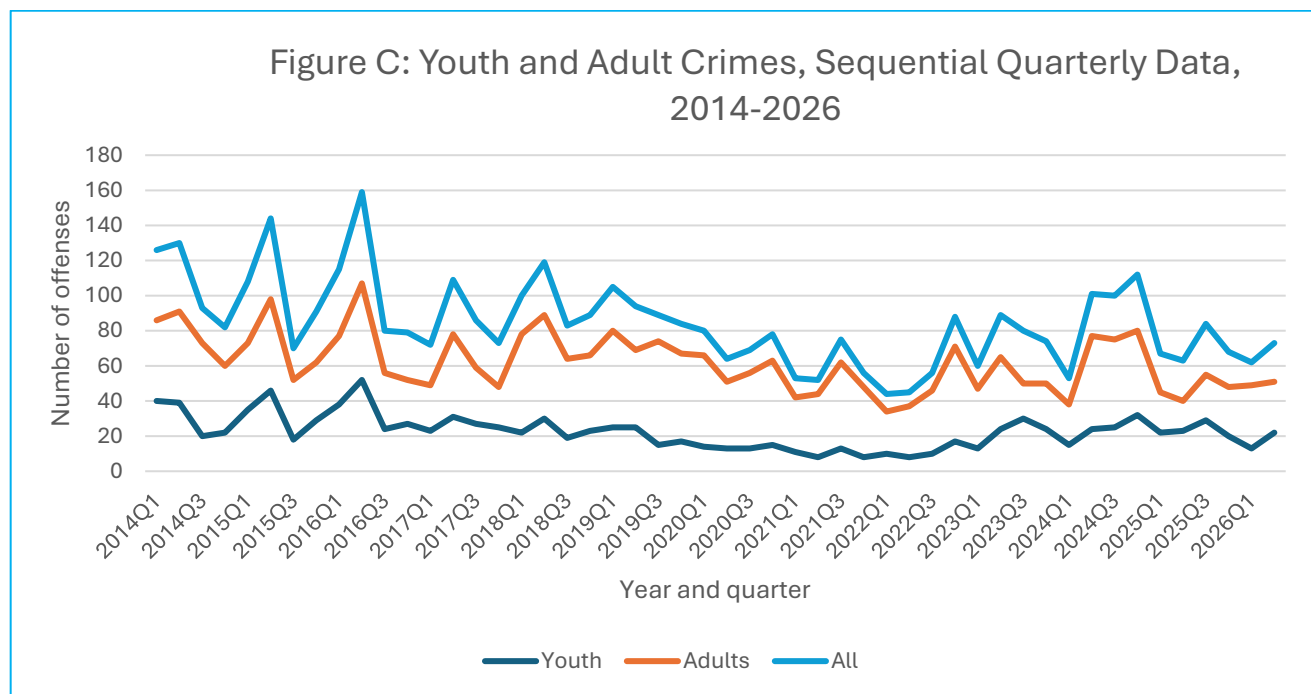


Figure C presents the sequential quarterly data from Q1 2014 through Q2 2026, with youth and adult crimes separated out. During this time period, offenses peaked at 159 (107 adult and 52 youth offenses) during 2016 Q2 and were lowest at 44 (34 adult and 10 youth offenses) during 2022 Q1. Looking at the overall sequence, it

does appear that there may be a plateauing or slight upward trend forming from 2022 as noted in Figures A and B.

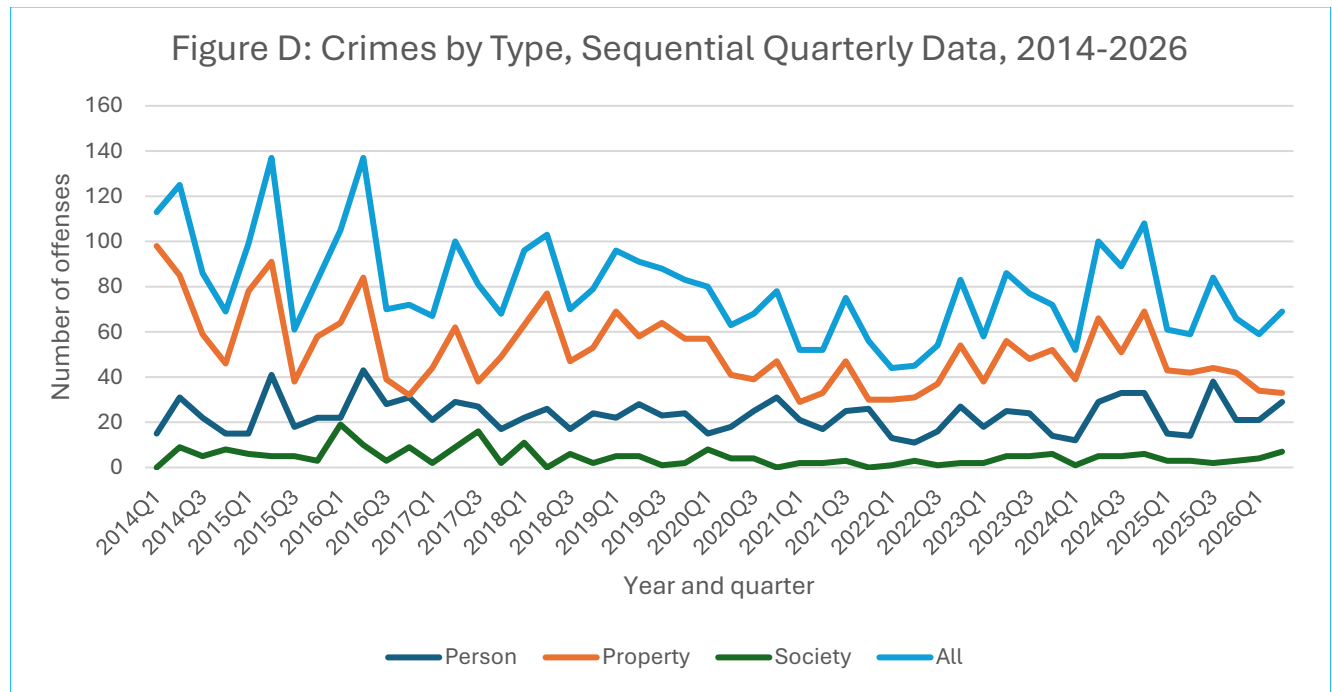


Figure D presents the sequential quarterly data from Q1 2014 through Q2 2026, with crime types separated out (including Person, Property, and Society offenses). During this time period, peak values for Property offenses were 98 during 2014 Q1; peak values for Person offenses were 43 during 2016 Q2, though it should be noted 2025 Q3 approached that high with 38 offenses; and peak values for Society offenses were 19 during 2016 Q1.

All Events: December - February 2014-2026

- **Youth:** There were 260 offenses involving youth (90 Persons, 129 Property, 17 Society, and 24 Other) in all hotspots in December – February 2014 – 2026.
- **Adults:** There were 708 offenses involving adults (179 Persons, 454 Property, 36 Society, and 39 Other) in all hotspots in December – February 2014 – 2026.

Figure 1: Offenses Involving Youth

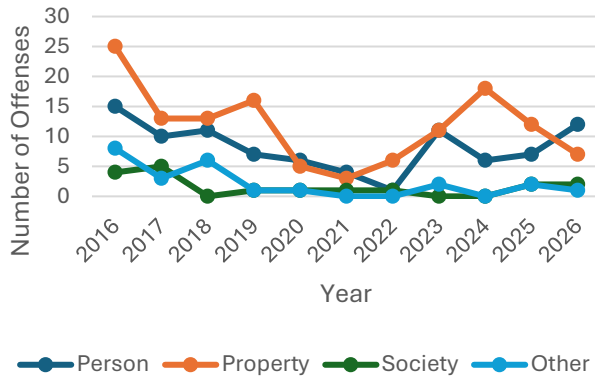
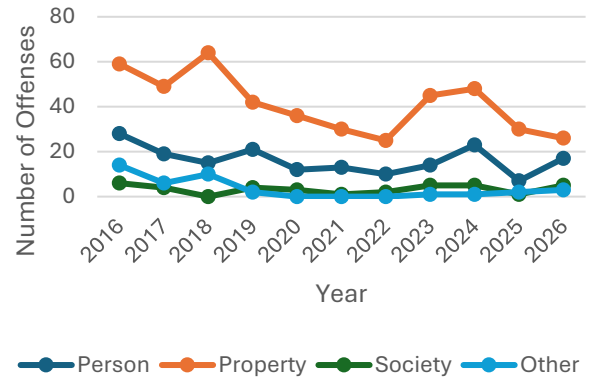


Figure 2: Offenses Involving Adults

Person-specific Events: December - February 2014-2026

- **Youth:** There were 84 offenses (30 aggravated assaults, 31 simple assaults, and 23 robbery) in all hotspots in December – February 2014 – 2026.
- **Adults:** There were 182 offenses committed by adults (53 aggravated assaults, 75 simple assaults, and 54 robbery) in all hotspots in December – February 2014-2026.

Figure 3: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

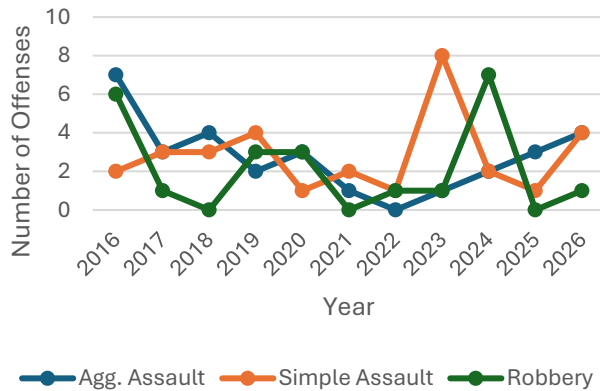
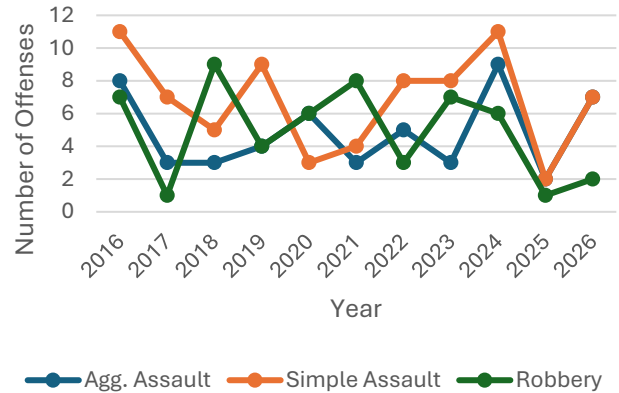


Figure 4: Specific Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 5: Offenses Involving Youth

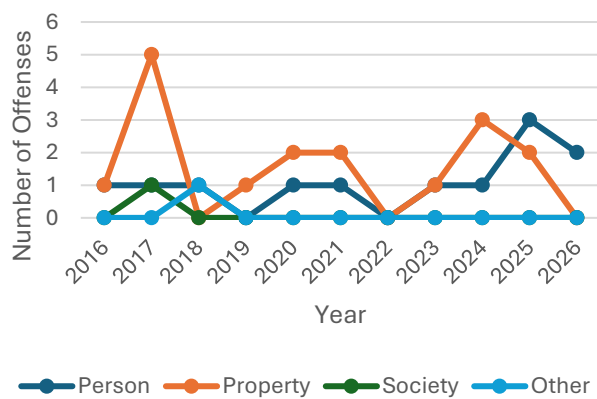
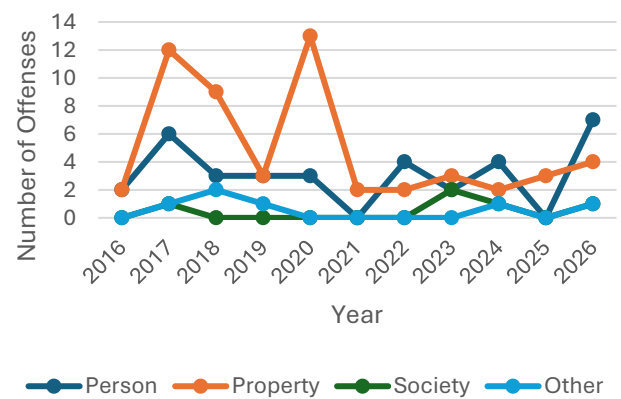


Figure 6: Offenses Involving Adults

- **Adults:** There were 30 person-specific offenses involving adults (11 aggravated assaults, 14 simple assaults, and 6 robbery) in the Rose Street Hotspot from December to February 2014-2026.

Figure 7: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

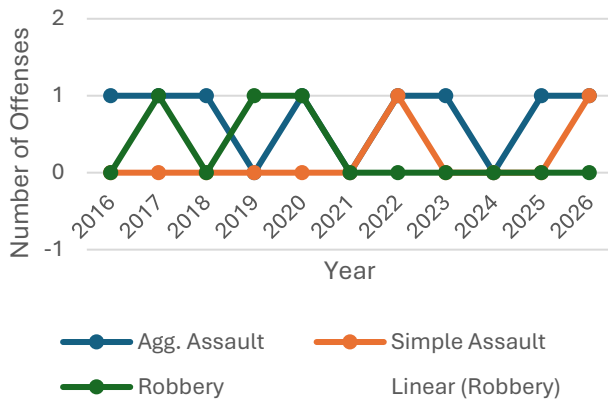
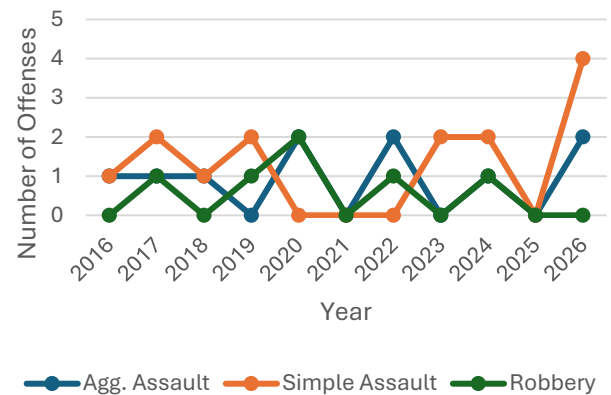


Figure 8: Specific Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 9: Offenses Involving Youth

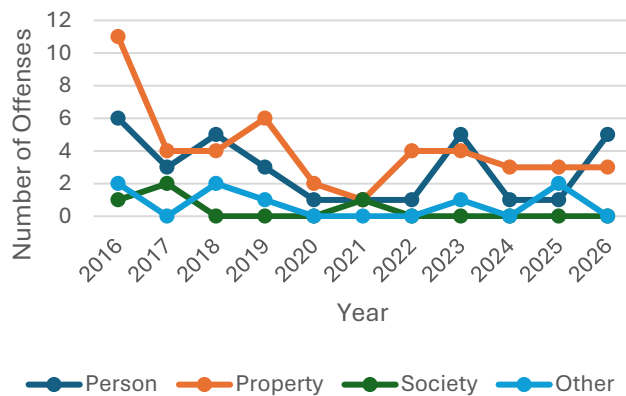
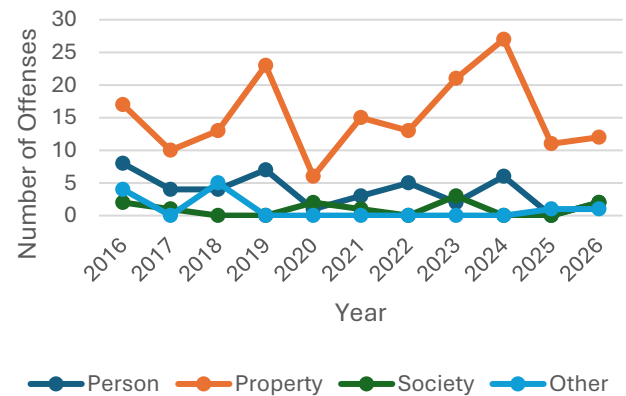


Figure 10: Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 11: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

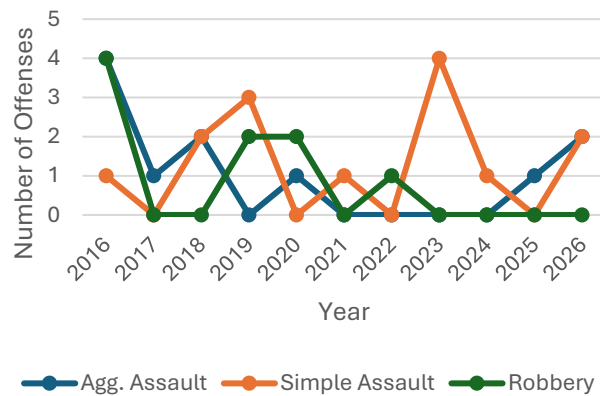
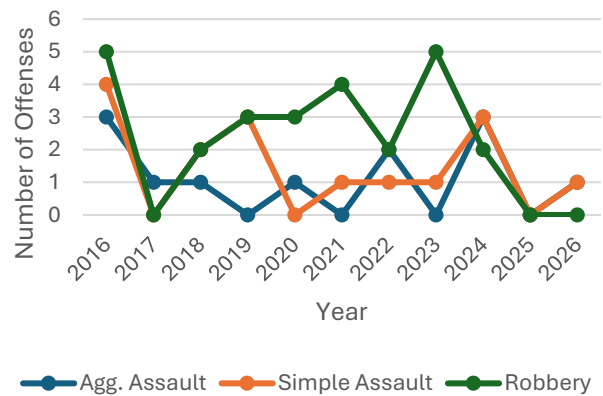


Figure 12: Specific Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 13: Offenses Involving Youth

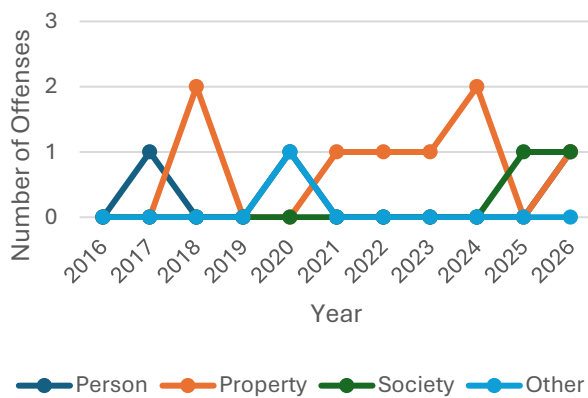
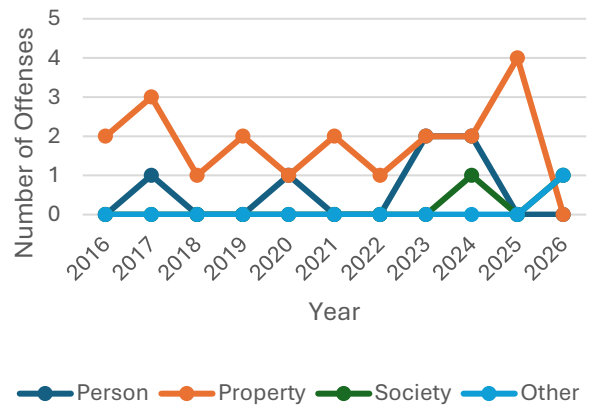


Figure 14: Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 15: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

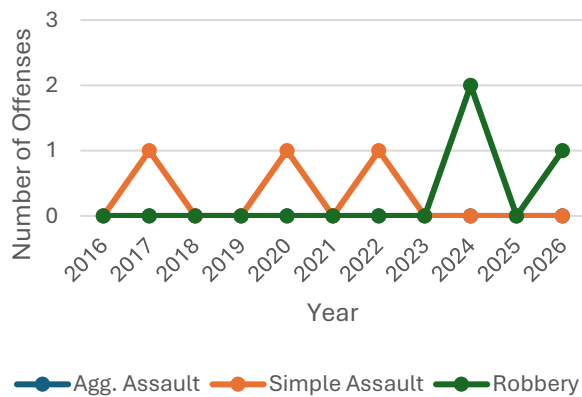
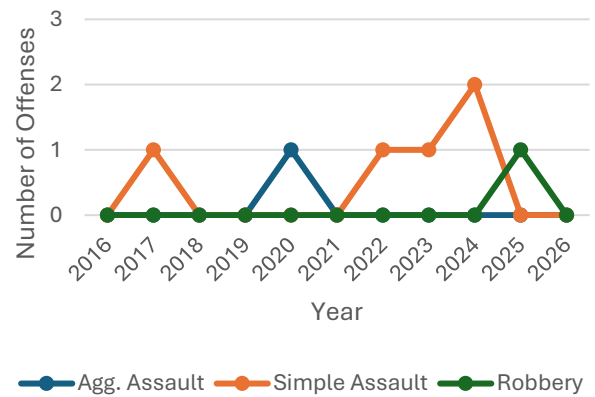


Figure 16: Specific Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 17: Offenses Involving Youth

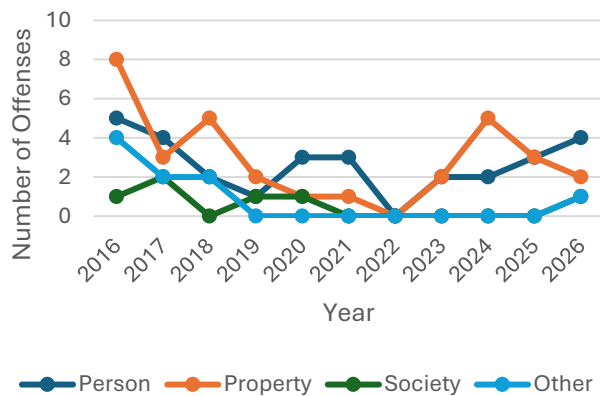
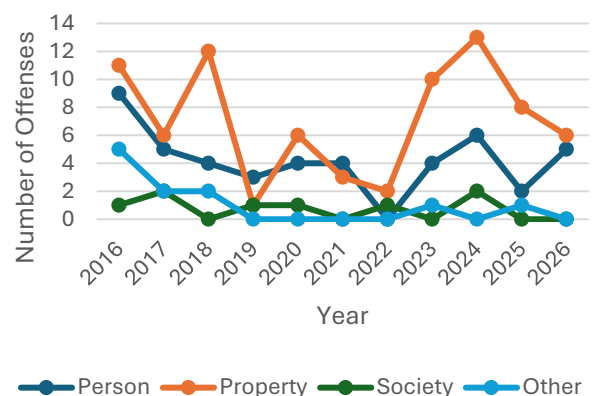


Figure 18: Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 19: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

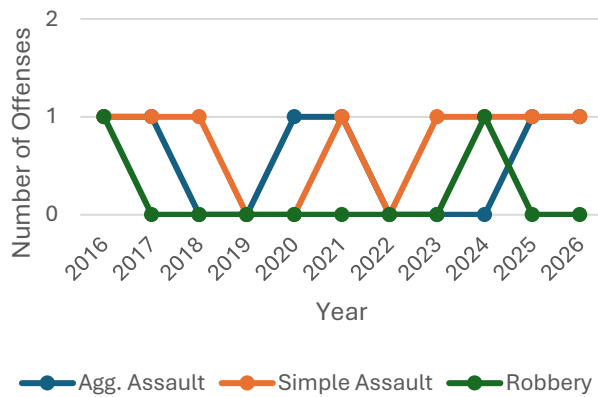
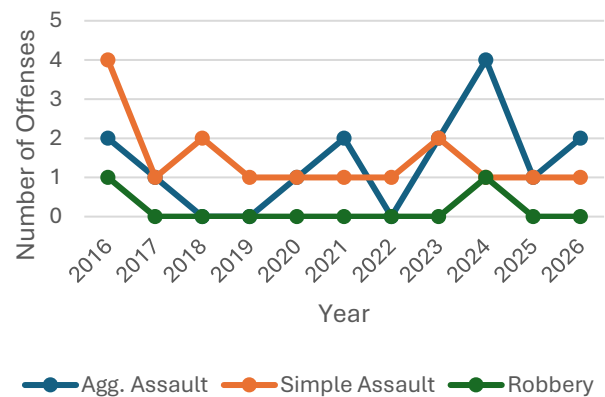


Figure 20: Specific Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 21: Offenses Involving Youth

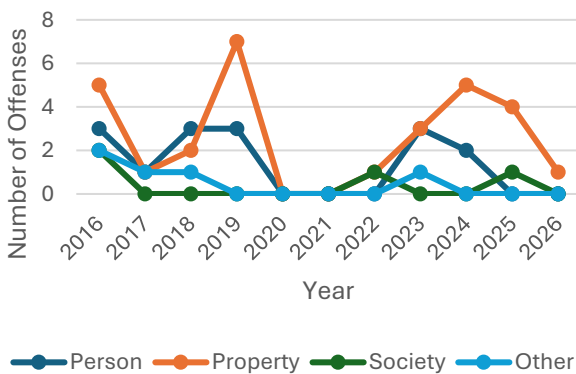
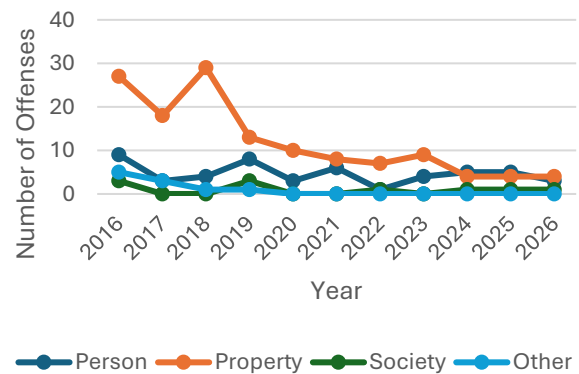


Figure 22: Offenses Involving Adults

Figure 23: Specific Offenses Involving Youth

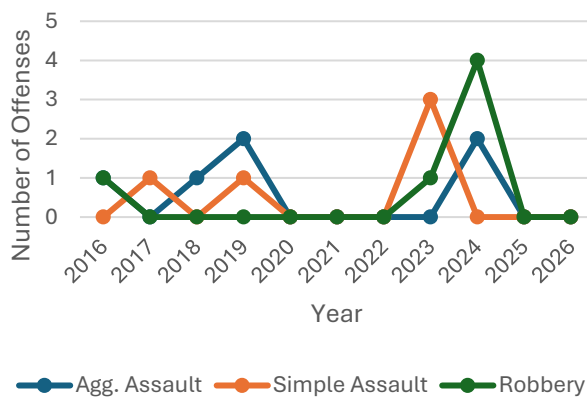
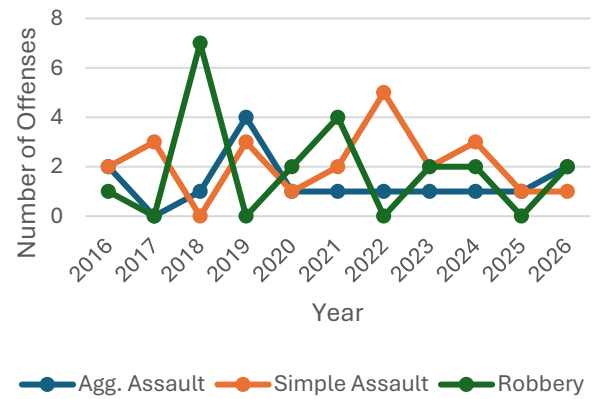


Figure 24: Specific Offenses Involving Adults
